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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY




LETTER TO THE GOVERNOR AND OHIO GENERAL ASSEMBLY



MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the State Cosmetology and Barber Board is to protect and support the public through regulation and education while promoting the integrity of the cosmetology and barbering industry.

BOARD BACKGROUND, AUTHORITY, AND FUNCTIONS

- The Board

On January 21, 2018, under provisions passed in Am. Sub. H.B. 49, the Ohio State Barber Board and the Ohio State Board of Cosmetology were merged to form the State Cosmetology and Barber Board. Prior to 2018, each Board functioned independently as autonomous agencies. The new Board is composed of thirteen members who are appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Ohio Senate. The Board is a diverse group of persons who are representative of the barber and cosmetology industry, businesses (barbershops, salons, and schools), medical practice, and the public. The composition of the Board is as follows:

- (1) One individual holding a current, valid cosmetologist or cosmetology instructor license at the time of appointment;**
- (2) Two individuals holding current, valid cosmetologist licenses and actively engaged in managing beauty salons for a period of not less than five years at the time of appointment;**

- (3) One individual who holds a current, valid independent contractor license at the time of appointment and practices a branch of cosmetology;
- (4) One individual who represents individuals who teach the theory and practice of a branch of cosmetology at a vocational or career-technical school;
- (5) One owner or executive actively engaged in the daily operations of a licensed school of cosmetology;
- (6) One owner of at least five licensed salons;
- (7) One individual who is either a certified nurse practitioner or clinical nurse specialist holding a current, valid license to practice nursing as an advanced practice registered nurse issued under Chapter 4723 of the Revised Code or a physician authorized under Chapter 4731. of the Revised Code to practice medicine and surgery or osteopathic medicine and surgery;
- (8) One individual representing the general public;
- (9) One individual who holds a current, valid tanning permit and who has owned or managed a tanning facility for at least five years immediately preceding the individual's appointment;
- (10) One individual who holds a current, valid esthetician license and who has been actively practicing esthetics for a period of not less than five years immediately preceding the individual's appointment;
- (11) Two barbers, one of whom is an employer barber and one of whom is employed as a barber, both of whom have been licensed as barbers in this state for at least five years immediately preceding their appointment.

Each member serves a five-year term. Members receive a per diem amount for each day employed in the discharge of their official duties. All members are reimbursed according to state travel rules for travel expenses. The current membership is:

Two positions are currently unfilled: a Tanning facility owner and an Employee Barber. The State Cosmetology and Barber Board is required to meet at least four times each year, but normally meets on a monthly basis. In addition to regular Board meetings, the Board has established several committees to improve efficiency, which permits the Board to address subject-specific issues and make recommendations to the full Board. Among these are:

- 1. Curriculum Review Committee – The Curriculum Review Committee is tasked with reviewing the curriculum standard for cosmetology, branch of cosmetology, and barber programs. Educational curriculums are reviewed to assure the programs provide the coursework necessary for students to take and pass the minimal competency examination for each type of license issued by the Board. The Committee recommends curriculum changes to the Board for approval.**
- 2. Rules Review Committee – the Rules Review Committee is tasked with meeting with staff to consider new, amended, or proposed rescinded rules. The committee may accept, reject, or modify staff recommendations. Proposed rules are sent to the full Board for consideration. The process provides an efficient review that streamlines drafting processes and results in rules that are better formulated, taking into consideration input from interested parties and regulated persons.**

Additionally, one member is assigned as a Board liaison to a staff workgroup called the Administrative Review Group. The Administrative Review Group was created and charged with reviewing complaints, inspections, and investigations to determine if the findings warrant the issuance of a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing, or if the matter should be dismissed for legal or jurisdictional reasons. Additionally, the Administrative Review Group may review settlement agreement conditions, proposed Notices of Opportunity for Hearing to determine if the inspection report findings correlate to alleged violations, and other actions taken by the Board. The workgroup takes no action and does not conduct any business on behalf of the Board. All recommendations must go before the full Board for consideration before implementation.

- Function

The State Cosmetology and Barber Board is a multi-dimensional agency authorized under Chapters 4709 and 4713 of the Revised Code. Under the authority established by law, the Board regulates individuals and businesses engaged in providing barbering, cosmetology, branches of cosmetology (e.g. Esthetics, Hair design, Manicuring, and Natural Hair Styling), boutique, and tanning services. Businesses regulated include barbershops and salons engaged in retail barbering and cosmetology services, tanning facilities, and barber and cosmetology schools.

In addition to its licensing duties, the Board routinely inspects businesses (barbershops, salons, tanning facilities, and schools) engaged in the provision of barbering, cosmetology, and tanning services. Inspectors issue reports in real-time using a web-based inspection system. Violations are noted, and businesses are required to post their inspection findings in a conspicuous place that is accessible to the public. Inspectors may issue a warning for some violations, based upon guidance established by the Board that takes into consideration the criticality of the violation. Other findings may result in the issuance of a formal Notice of Opportunity for Hearing issued under Chapter 119 of the Revised Code. Additionally, the Board also receives and processes

complaints from the public. Complaints may result in a formal investigation or inspection depending upon the nature of the complaint. An investigation may also lead to the issuance of a formal Notice of Opportunity for Hearing issued under Chapter 119 of the Revised Code. In all respects, persons (including individuals, barbershops, salons, schools, or tanning facilities) alleged to have committed a violation of Chapter 4709 or 4713 of the Revised Code, or rules promulgated thereunder, are afforded an opportunity for a hearing under the applicable provisions of law.

Following an adjudication hearing held pursuant to Chapter 119 of the Revised Code, the Board may act against a licensed barbershop, salon, school, tanning facility, or person licensed as a barber, cosmetologist, esthetician, hairstylist, manicurist, natural hair stylist, or a boutique service registrant. Within the parameters of applicable law under Chapters 4709 and 4713 of the Revised Code, the Board may refuse to issue or renew, deny, suspend, or revoke a license. Additionally, the Board may also levy fines, require corrective action courses, or imposes conditions on certain licenses.

If a person or facility is found practicing or operating without a license, permit, or registration, the Board may seek an injunction or appropriate restraining order for such practice in the county where the violation occurred. The Office of the Ohio Attorney General, upon the Board's request, may pursue appropriate relief through the court of common pleas in the county in which the violation occurred.

Official actions of the Board are journalized in the minutes of each meeting. In FY 2018, the Board held nine regular meetings. Board meeting minutes are available to the public by mail, electronic mail, and a full year or more of minutes are maintained on the Board's website. The Board disseminates information concerning its activities, forms, notices, and Board member profiles on its state website: www.cos.ohio.gov.

- Funding

The Board is self-sustained through fees generated from applications for initial licensure, renewal fees, fines, and other miscellaneous sources. The Board's fees are deposited into the Occupational and Professional Licensing Fund (called the "4K9" fund) consisting of revenue from twenty-seven commissions and professional licensing boards. Each agency in the fund is required to generate sufficient revenue to meet its own expenses. Although the 4K9 fund serves as the funding source for the Board, it is not a rotary fund. The Board is funded through the standard biennial budget process, meaning the Ohio General Assembly establishes the Board's biennial budget. Every two years the Board reviews licensure fees and budget requirements to determine if fee adjustments are necessary.

- Staffing

During FY 2018, the Board employed 44 full-time staff. The staff consists of an Executive Director 1.0 FTE, Deputy Director 1.0 FTE, exempt Supervisory/Administrative staff 6.0 FTE, Customer Service staff 4.0 FTE, Examiners 5.0 FTE, Field Inspectors 15.0 FTE, Administrative Action staff 3.0 FTE, Exam/Licensing staff 7.0 FTE, and Administrative/Fiscal staff 2.0 FTE.

- Location and hours of operation

The office is located at 1929 Gateway Circle, Grove City, Ohio. The agency business hours are from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

In fiscal year 2018, the Board was able to conduct its business during one-day meetings. Meeting dates are posted on the Board's website and meeting notices and agendas are posted no less than five days prior to a scheduled meeting. Following Board approval at each meeting, the minutes are posted to the agency's website for public review. The Board's business agenda follows a regular process that includes the approval of prior meeting minutes, officer and staff reports, committee meeting reports, new business, old business, and unfinished business. As required, the Board must also address administrative matters under Chapter 119 of the Revised Code, including administrative disciplinary hearings. Education, examination, licensure, and inspection/administrative action data represented below takes into consideration aggregated data from the Ohio State Barber Board and the Ohio State Board of Cosmetology prior to the merger of the two Boards on January 21, 2018. This information is presented in this manner to properly represent the statistical data for these activities for the full fiscal year, which will permit better comparative analysis with past and future activity.

Education

The State Cosmetology and Barber Board is responsible for licensing private, career technical, adult, and Department of Rehabilitation programs that offer training in barbering, cosmetology, or branches of cosmetology. Schools in Ohio may offer training in barbering, cosmetology, manicuring, esthetics, hair design, and natural hair styling.

The State Cosmetology and Barber Board is responsible for the licensing of schools of barbering and cosmetology/branches of cosmetology. There are four distinct types of schools that offer educational programs in either barbering or cosmetology/branches of cosmetology: Adult Education – Public Schools, Career Technical, Rehabilitation and Corrections, and Private Schools.

Career Technical Schools are affiliated with the public-school system offering a comprehensive educational approach to complete both primary education requirements and training in technical theory and practical skills in cosmetology or branches of cosmetology.

Adult Education programs through a Career Technical School are programs offered by the Career Technical School as an after-hours program for adult learners returning to increase their skills in a specific career track, such as cosmetology or branches of cosmetology.

Rehabilitation and Corrections Schools are located in Ohio correction facilities. These programs offer all training hours required to qualify for a license in cosmetology and barbering. The Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction offers one cosmetology and five barbering programs in system facilities throughout the state.

Private Schools are proprietary businesses that offer education and training in technical theory and practical skills in barbering, cosmetology, or branches of cosmetology. The National Accrediting Commission of Cosmetology Arts and Science (NACCAS) accredits most of these schools. The Accrediting Commission of Career Schools and Colleges is also an organization that offers accreditation. Accreditation is not a specific requirement under Ohio laws and rules.

The State Cosmetology and Barber Board currently licenses 15 private barber colleges, 1 adult education barber school, and 5 rehabilitation and correction barber schools. For cosmetology and/or branches of cosmetology, the Board licenses 88 Career Technical Schools, 61 Private Schools, 20 Adult Education programs, and 1 Rehabilitation and Correction cosmetology school.

Programs taught include:

- (1) Barbering, which includes shaving the face, haircuts or styling, facials, skin care, scalp massage, shampooing, bleaching, coloring, straightening, or permanent waving hair, and cutting, fitting, or forming head caps for wigs or hairpieces.
- (2) Cosmetology, which includes all branches of cosmetology.
- (3) Esthetics, which includes the application of cosmetics, tonics, antiseptics, creams, lotions, or other preparations for skin beautification and includes preparation of the skin by manual massage techniques or by use of electrical, mechanical, or other apparatus.
- (4) Hair design, which includes embellishing or beautifying hair, wigs, or hairpieces by arranging, dressing, pressing, curling, waving, permanent waving, cleansing, cutting, singeing, bleaching, coloring, braiding, weaving, or similar work. The practice of hair design also includes utilizing techniques performed by hand that result in tension on hair roots such as twisting, wrapping, weaving, extending, locking, or braiding of the hair.
- (5) Manicuring, which includes manicuring the nails of any person, applying artificial or sculptured nails to any person, massaging the hands and lower arms up to the elbow of any person, massaging the feet and lower legs up to the knee of any person, or any combination of these four types of services.
- (6) Natural hair styling, which includes utilizing techniques, performed by hand that result in tension on hair roots such as twisting, wrapping, weaving, extending, locking, or braiding of the hair.

During FY 2018, 7 cosmetology schools closed in the state of Ohio and one new school opened.

Examinations

In FY 2018, the Board transitioned from a Board developed and administered theory examination in cosmetology and each branch of cosmetology to a nationally developed and validated examination vendor. Beginning August 2018, the Board transitioned the Barber theory examination to the same format. This system allows the Board to offer up-to-date validated examinations to our license candidates. Candidates can schedule their own examinations through the state's new eLicense Ohio system. The Board develops the agency's practical examination for cosmetology, branches or cosmetology, and barbering. The theory and practical examinations are administered at the Board's examination center located in

Grove City, Ohio. A computer-based theory examination tests minimum competency on subject matter required to safely practice, and a practical examination evaluates procedures for safety, sanitation, and minimum competency when rendering cosmetology or barbering services.

Examinations are offered year-round. Typically, the examination center has examinations schedule every day of the week throughout the year. The examination center is designed to accommodate up to 50 practical examinations and 30 theory examinations per session. The examination system integrates with Ohio’s eLicense system. Results are automatically uploaded and licenses can be issued immediately upon passing the theory and practical examinations and filing the license application. This same day service allows licensees to begin working in the industry immediately after successfully completing their competency examination for their intended careers.

Barbering Examinations:

The Ohio State Barber Board reported administering 161 barber examinations prior to the merger of both boards on January 21, 2018. Following the merger, the State Cosmetology and Barber Board administered 160 barber practical/theory examinations and 4 barber teacher examinations. The average pass rate for barber examinations during this period was 84%.

Cosmetology Examinations:

During FY 2018, the Board administered a total of 6,303 theory-based examinations and 4,821 practical examinations for cosmetology and branches of cosmetology. The following represents the examinations scheduled and taken during FY 2018.

In FY 2018, the Board administered 1316 advanced practice examinations (including retakes of the examination). This represents a 2.8% increase in the number of advanced practice examinations administered in FY 2018 compared to the number administered in FY 2017. In FY 2017, the Board predicted that the number of new advanced licenses would diminish based

on revisions implemented in early FY 2017 under Am. Sub. S.B. 213. Three changes in the statute had an effect on the number of persons seeking advanced practice licenses: (1) An amendment removed a long-standing requirement to have a person with a Manager's license be available during salon business hours; (2) An amendment eliminated the Manager license and replaced it with an Advanced practice license. Since there is no mandatory requirement to hold an advanced license, the marketplace and personal career objective are the primary drivers for persons seeking an Advanced license, and (3) An amendment eliminated the requirement to hold a manager license in order to qualify for an Independent Contractor license. Current data supports the original projections. Today, the Board issues nearly 60% fewer advance licenses than the former Manager licenses issued in FY 2016.

Licensure

The State Cosmetology and Barber Board is responsible for the licensing of individuals engaged in providing barbering, cosmetology, or branches of cosmetology services (e.g. Manicuring, Esthetics, Hair design, and Natural Hair Styling). The Board licenses salons engaged in retail cosmetology services, branch of cosmetology services, and tanning services. The Board is responsible for the licensure of educational programs designed to prepare persons for careers in barbering, cosmetology, or branches of cosmetology. In 2016, pursuant to Am. Sub. S.B. 213, the Board began issuing permits to persons engaged in limited services, called "boutique services." Additionally, the Board began issuing Boutique Services salon licenses to businesses engaged in the provision of boutique services.

2018 Licensing Activity

Professional licensing:

The State Cosmetology and Barber Board is responsible for the issuance and regulation of many professional licenses. In the practice of barbering, three licenses are issued: Barber, Barber Teacher, and Assistant Barber Teacher. In the practice of cosmetology or branch of cosmetology, the Board issues two types of practicing licenses: a basic practicing license and an advanced practicing license. Additionally, the Board issues an instructor license for persons seeking authorization to teach cosmetology or a branch of cosmetology, and an Independent Contractor license to persons that rent booth space in salons. Persons that lease or rent a barber chair within a licensed barbershop are required to hold a separate chair license for that service. Last, the Board issues a Boutiques Service Registration, at no cost, for persons engaging in boutiques services. The scope of services covered under the boutique services registration are shampooing, braiding, and threading.

Business licensing:

Beauty salon and cosmetology school licenses are issued by the Board and are designated according to the scope of practice rendered: cosmetology, esthetics, manicuring, hair design, natural hair styling, or boutique services. Barbershops are licensed to provide barber services, but other additional services, such as manicuring can be offered at a barbershop. Barber schools are licensed to provide barbering education only. Additionally, the State Cosmetology and Barber Board issues permits to tanning facilities. Tanning facilities, pursuant to provisions of law, must restrict access or limit service based upon the age of the person seeking to use the tanning equipment. The State Cosmetology and Barber Board develops consent

forms, conforming to the Revised Code, which clearly state the risk factors associated with tanning and skin exposure to radiation produced by UV light sources used in tanning systems.



due to the biennial renewal cycle. Therefore, it is best to consider comparisons to the last even or odd numbered year. License issuance trends for FY 2018 were mixed – some license types saw growth and some saw a decrease. For example, FY 2018 active instructor licenses for all cosmetology license types decreased, on average, 19.6% since FY 2016. The most likely reason for this change is the effect of new changes implemented under Am. Sub. S.B. 213, effective September 13, 2018, which added an examination requirement to obtain an instructor license. Additionally, advanced licenses, when compared to their predecessor the “Manager” license decreased by an average of 7.9% for cosmetology, hair design, and manicuring licenses. Again, changes introduced in Am. Sub. S.B. 213 in 2016 eliminated the need to hold a “Manager” license to manage a salon and holding a manager license (or now the “advanced” license) is no longer a requirement to obtain an independent contractor license. In contrast, active Salon licenses showed an average 9.3% increase over the past two years. Additionally, while active cosmetology licenses slightly decreased over the past two years, other practice licenses showed significant increases over the past two years (Estheticians 29.8%. Manicurists 10.9%, and Natural hair stylist 16.7%).


The number of active Barber licenses were essentially unchanged over the past two years. Active barbershop licenses decreased by 2.4%. 9,597 persons (7% of overall licensees)

maintained an inactive cosmetologist/branch of cosmetology license in FY 2018. Commonly referred to an “escrowed” license, this group represents persons that voluntarily request to have their license placed in an inactive status. This status can be maintained until a person chooses to return to active practice. The majority of persons (79%) in an inactive status are cosmetologists.

A notable increase in the number of boutique services salons (78% increase) and boutique service registrations (183% increase) between FY 2017 and FY 2018 demonstrated the new program was succeeding and meeting the intended legislative mandate.



With few exceptions, new licenses issued during FY 2018 decreased when compared to FY 2017 activity. Some exceptions include boutique services registration (39% increase), esthetician practice licenses (29% increase), esthetic salon licenses (10% increase), manicurist (10% increase), and tanning facilities (37% increase).



Inspections/Complaints/Administrative Action


The State Cosmetology and Barber Board is authorized under ORC Chapters 4709 and 4713 to inspect facilities licensed by the Board. Additionally, the Board may investigate complaints filed by consumers. Pursuant to the findings of inspections, the Board may impose disciplinary action against individual licensees, barbershops, salons, schools, or tanning facilities for violating standards of practice in the provision of services. Hearings are held in accordance with Chapter 119 of the Revised Code. Alternative settlement agreements (Consent Agreements) are regularly offered in lieu of a hearing. Once approved by the Board, Settlement Agreements are entered upon the Board's journal as an Order of the Board.

The State Cosmetology and Barber Board employs one inspection supervisor who, under the supervision of the agency's Chief of Staff, investigates complaints filed by consumers, licensees, barbershops, or salons in the state of Ohio. Additionally, the State Cosmetology and Barber Board employs 15 field inspectors under the supervision of the Inspection Supervisor, who conduct assigned and random inspections of barbershops, cosmetology salons, branches of cosmetology salons (Esthetic salons, Hair Design salons, Manicuring salons, Natural Hair Styling salons, and Boutique Services salons), schools, and tanning facilities. Inspection findings can be issued directly to barbershops, salons, schools, independent contractors, and/or individual licensees or permit holders depending upon the inspection findings. Inspectors are based from their home area and are assigned regional coverage areas. The three largest metropolitan areas are Cleveland, Columbus, and Cincinnati.

In FY 2018, State Cosmetology and Barber Board field inspectors attempted 10,270 inspections representing 7,510 salons visited (Cosmetology - 5920, Hair Design - 248, Esthetics - 515, Manicuring - 772, Natural Hair Styling - 14, and Boutique Services - 41), 799 Barbershops, 755 Tanning facilities, 173 Cosmetology Schools, 1018 individual licensees (basic cosmetology and branches of cosmetology licensees, advanced licensees, and independent contractors), and 15 unlicensed businesses. Of these, 952 were reported as "No Contact," meaning the business was not open or the inspector could not gain entry into the premises. 9,318 inspections were successfully carried out. The Board issued 7,773 approved (no violation) inspection reports, 586 inspection reports citing violations of Ohio law or rule, and 959 inspection reports citing a violation of Ohio law or rule, but providing a warning in lieu of a violation. A total of 728 individual violations and 1,069 warnings were issued.

- ❖ **Additionally, the Ohio State Barber Board completed 2,447 barbershop inspections prior to the merger of the two boards on January 21, 2018. Of these, the Ohio State Barber Board issued 407 warnings and 37 violations. The Ohio State Barber Board also conducted 120 investigations based upon complaints received.**

Administrative Action Summary:

During FY 2018, the State Cosmetology and Barber Board held 21 hearings in accordance with Chapter 119 of the Revised Code. Six hundred sixty-five cases cited did not request a hearing before the Board, resulting in an Order entered upon the Board’s journal. In total, 309 Board Orders and 373 consent agreements were approved and entered upon the Board’s journal as Orders of the Board.

INDUSTRY OUTLOOK AND CONDITIONS

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics 2017 study projects an average 13% national employment growth for barbering, cosmetology, esthetics, hairstyling, and manicuring occupations through 2026. Job outlook data on the tanning industry is not readily available. The beauty industry is relatively recession resistant. Changes in hair design and fashion are universal and not prone to stagnation. People will always seek services to keep up with trends and style preference. As a result, business generated in these personal care services will likely see continued growth. In addition, as recognition for healthy lifestyle choices have become important, image and expression are also being recognized as an essential element to good health. Traditional barbering services are seeing a resurgence and male grooming trends, such as beards are leading new trends. Barbering, Cosmetology, and its associated arts are illustrative of a vibrant, important contributor to private industry in the state of Ohio.

CONCLUSIONS

The Board is an active state agency, representing approximately 134,000 individuals and businesses in the state of Ohio. The Board is continually challenging itself to provide services in a cost-effective and efficient manner, holding individuals and business accountable for providing clean, safe services for Ohioans seeking quality beauty services. The Board will continue to learn from its experiences and apply regulatory efforts, within the jurisdiction and authority of Chapters 4709 and 4713 of the Revised Code, that balance effective regulation against over-regulation that restricts business growth.

XIV. The number of adjudications or other disciplinary action taken by the board:

During FY 2018, the State Cosmetology and Barber Board held 21 hearings in accordance with Chapter 119 of the Revised Code. Six hundred sixty-five cases cited did not request a hearing before the Board, resulting in an Order entered upon the Board's journal. In total, 309 Board Orders and 373 consent agreements were approved and entered upon the Board's journal as Orders of the Board.
