

## Barber 1800 Curriculum

<b>Subject Area</b>
<p><b>At least 100 hours of theoretical study</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Scientific fundamentals of barbering;</li><li>• Hygiene and bacteriology;</li><li>• Histology of the hair, skin and nerves;</li><li>• Structure of the head, face and neck (anatomy and physiology);</li><li>• Elementary chemistry relating to barbering sterilization and antiseptic;</li><li>• Diseases of the skin, hair and glands;</li><li>• Barber history;</li><li>• Law pertaining to barbering;</li><li>• Salesmanship, advertising, public relations, and human relations; and</li><li>• Barber ethics and shop management.</li><li>• <b>Human Trafficking Education (1-Hour)</b></li></ul>
<p><b>At least 200 hours of scientific barbering practice</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Facial treatments (rolling cream - rest facial - packs - bleach - clay);</li><li>• Shampoo treatments (plain shampoo and tonic - hot oil shampoo);</li><li>• Tinting;</li><li>• Bleaching;</li><li>• Facial shaving;</li><li>• Haircutting I (tapers);</li><li>• Haircutting II (style/trend cuts);</li><li>• Haircutting III (styling);</li><li>• Straightening and relaxing;</li><li>• Permanent waving;</li><li>• Hairpieces; and</li><li>• Barber implements.</li></ul>
<p><b>At least 1200 hours of general barber practice</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Facial treatments;</li><li>• Scalp treatments;</li><li>• Shampoo treatments;</li><li>• Tinting;</li><li>• Bleaching;</li><li>• Facial shaving;</li><li>• Haircutting I (tapers);</li><li>• Haircutting II (style/trend cuts);</li><li>• Haircutting III (styling);</li><li>• Hair straightening and relaxing;</li><li>• Permanent waving;</li><li>• Shop duties;</li><li>• Shop management; and</li><li>• Hair pieces.</li></ul>
<p>300 hours may be allocated by the school to related theory, practice or clinic as it deems necessary.</p>
